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Passage 1

Some say that nothing is more vivid or **memorable** than a picture. We disagree. No visual image is as vivid as the image created by the mind in response to words. The main function of the poet or the artist is, in fact, to enable people to see more deeply into things than they can with the unaided eye. **There is more to life than meets the eye**, and this is what good poetry or painting is all about.

It is not true that one picture is worth a thousand words. It takes only a few words if they are the right words to **ignite** the imagination and produce pictures that are far more colorful than anything within the range of electronic communications.

Yet the **ultimate** importance of print can be shown not by its superior images but by its ability to convey abstract ideas. No matter how intensive or prolonged a person's formal schooling may be, he is only partially educated if he is not able to think abstractly. He knows that the most important factor in the making of decision is abstract thought. No other medium of communications can equal the speed and accuracy of print in moving and abstract idea from one human brain to another. If we are not concerned with philosophy, then let us put an end to print because print is the natural habitat of philosophical ideas.
